## FOREIGN STUDENT POLICY

### GENERAL GUIDELINES TO FOREIGN STUDENT INTAKE

South Africa is emerging as one of the World's most exiting study destinations. This is demonstrated in the rapidly increasing number of International students, however HTA Group of Companies is an South African registered company, which core purpose is to provide Quality, Culinary Education at all levels through its different divisions.

**Should any of its divisions receive an application by a Foreign National, the following policy: must be adhered to:**

1. Foreign Students who do not have Permanent Residence in South Africa/ or are not South African Citizens need to consult their Embassy/ or Department of Home Affairs/ and or Department of Foreign affairs/ and or South Africa High Commission to obtain the specific legal requirements and other relevant documentation needed to study in South Africa.
2. Applicants who do not have the required documentation proof will not be permitted to study at HTA School of Culinary Art or HTA Industry Connection.

Further more to this it has been proven over the past number of years that South African based Corporate Companies and Businesses are very reluctant to sponsor or make a donation to non- South African Citizens/ non - Permanent Residents.

HTA and its Group of Companies are not opposed to the assistance of Foreign Nationals, however it is a firm believe that charity starts at home.

### STUDENT POLICY

1. If you are an International student intending to study in South Africa whether at a Primary, Secondary or Further Education Institution you must first apply for a Study Permit.
2. A South African Education Institute cannot register an International Student until a valid Student Permit is produced.
3. Also note that you cannot enter South Africa on a Visitors Visa and then apply for a Study Permit.
4. The student must be in the possession of a valid Passport.
5. Proof of being financially able to pay your tuition fees and have adequate means off support.
6. Medical Certification and proof of Medical Insurance cover usable in South Africa.
7. No Foreign students will be accepted unless their application complies with Government Legislation.
8. Students should be aware that being issued with a valid Student Permit does not guarantee acceptance to a Primary, Secondary and Further Education Institute.
